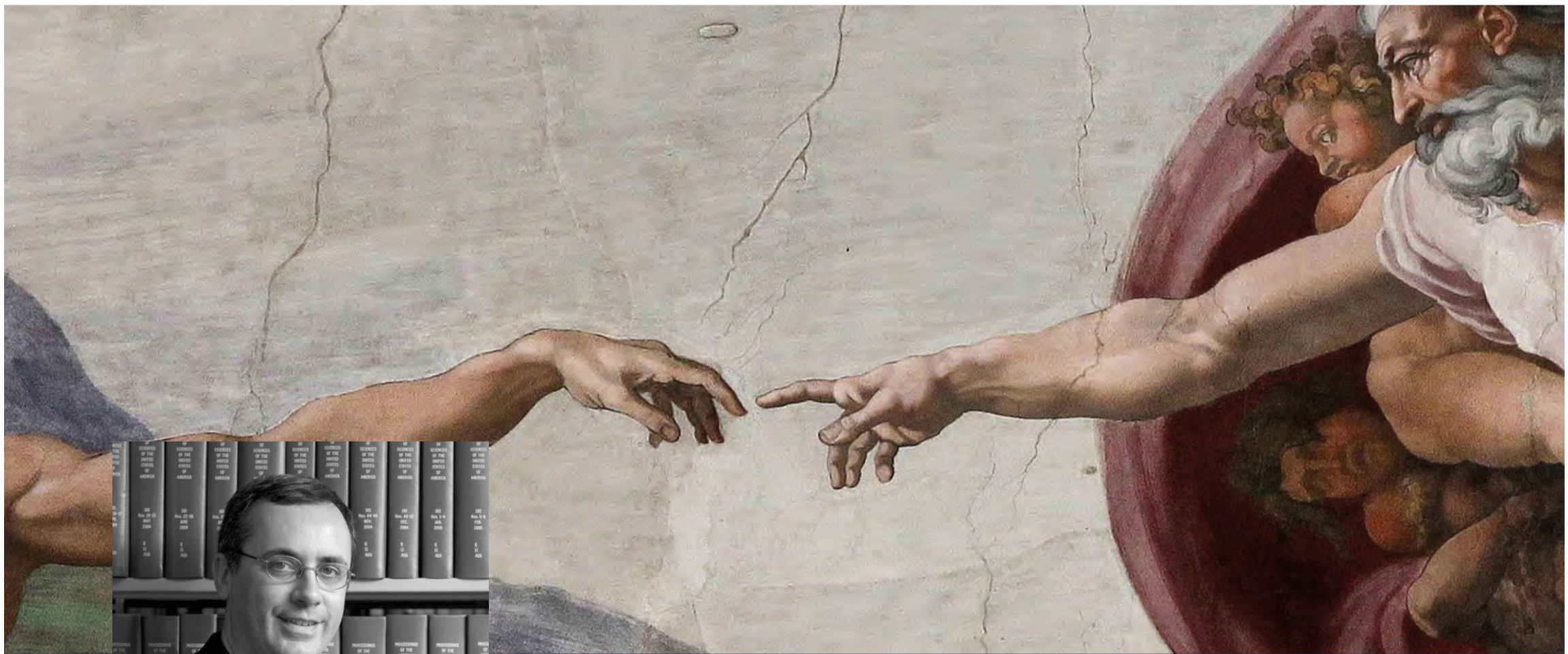


QUARR ABBEY THEOLOGICAL CONFERENCES

Fr Andrew is Research Director of the Ian Ramsey Centre for Science and Religion at the Faculty of Theology and Religion, University of Oxford. Formerly a particle physicist on the DELPHI experiment at CERN, he has degrees in philosophy and theology and a second doctorate in philosophy. A major theme of his research is second-person (I-you) relatedness in science, philosophy, and theology. His publications include work in virtue ethics, neurotheology, science and religion, the philosophy of the person, insight, divine action, and the nature of evil.

The topics to be covered are:

1. *"I count, therefore I am?"* Science and Faith in a Cartesian Age.
2. The Physical World and Machine Metaphors
3. The Biological Worldviews: Ends, Providence, and Purpose
4. Persons and their Brains
5. Concluding Remarks on Seeing Reality
